MEMBERS' ACTIVITIES & SIGNATURE EVENTS

During the year 2025–26 the Branch in association with the Regional Council Office and various Central Council Committees, organised a wide range of professional development programmes for Members. These seminars on ITAT Practice, Faceless Appeals, Practice-Development Skills, International Taxation, Bank Branch Audit and Insolvency and Bankruptcy Law. Major flagship events – the ICAI MSME Mahotsav, Capital Markets Conference, the Digital Transformation (Dx) Finance Summit - 2025, GCC Summit – 2025, the Sub-Regional Conference at Hyderabad and The CA Professional Summit 2026 – were also conducted, alongside Specialised Workshops on Appeals and Representation, GST Adjudication and Tribunal Practice, Peer Review, ADR mechanisms, RERA implementation and Real-Estate Consultancy Practice.

Signature events of the Year

Among the year's signature programmes, the DxFS 2025 Summit was conducted on 7th and 8th August 2025, witnessed by more than 1,200 Chartered Accountants; a full-day conference on Capital Markets was held at COE on 12th July 2025; GCC Summit 2025 was conducted on 9th and 10th October 2025 for the first time at Novotel, Hyderabad; a Seminar on International Taxation was held on 14th December 2025 at the Centre of Excellence; the Sub-Regional Conference was held on 23rd and 24th December 2025; a programme on Setting up Practice of Real Estate Consultancy, Compliance, Advisory & Evolving Frontiers was conducted in March 2026; and a three-day workshop on GSTART was held on 27th, 28th and 29th April 2026.

Women's Day Programme

The Hyderabad Branch proudly celebrated International Women's Day with great enthusiasm, drawing participation from over 100 women Members. To mark the occasion, a special seminar themed “Aspire, Adapt, Achieve – Pioneering Change, Setting Trends” was organised, focused on professional excellence, personal development, leadership and the empowerment of women in the Chartered Accountancy profession. The Chief Guest, Smt. Bhagwathi Baldawa, inspired the participants and other speakers shared valuable knowledge in sessions that fostered meaningful discussion, networking and recognition of the significant contributions made by women Chartered Accountants.

Meet & Greet with the Hon'ble President & Hon'ble Vice-President of ICAI

The Branch had the privilege of hosting CA. Prasanna Kumar D., Hon'ble President and CA. Pandurang Kinnare, Hon'ble Vice-President of ICAI. The event drew an overwhelming response, with more than 800 Members participating in an interactive session in which the Hon'ble President and Hon'ble Vice-President shared their vision for the profession and the Institute, highlighting future opportunities, challenges and strategic initiatives to strengthen the Chartered Accountancy profession. Their inspiring addresses provided valuable guidance to Members on adapting to the evolving professional landscape and offered a deeper understanding of ICAI's roadmap for the future.

Digital Transformation (Dx) Finance Summit 2026

The Hyderabad Branch, in association with the Digital Accounting and Assurance Board (DAAB) of ICAI, successfully organised the Digital Transformation (Dx) Finance Summit 2026 – on 22nd and 23rd May 2026 at the Novotel Hyderabad Convention Centre. Themed “Fortifying Finance: Forensics, Cybersecurity & Digital Trust,” the summit emerged as one of the flagship events of the year, attracting over 1,200 professionals from Digital Assurance, Forensic Accounting, Information Systems Audit, Cybersecurity, Data Protection and Governance, Risk & Compliance.

The event was organised in association with the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), Cyber Dost, the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) and the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE), with HYSEA and TiE Hyderabad serving as Ecosystem Partners. The Inaugural Session on 22nd May 2026 was graced by Hon'ble Shri Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Minister for Information Technology, Electronics & Communications, Industries & Commerce and Legislative Affairs, Government of Telangana, as Chief Guest. In his keynote address, the Minister commended ICAI's efforts in promoting cyber resilience and digital trust within the financial ecosystem and reaffirmed the Government of Telangana's commitment to fostering innovation, technological advancement and secure digital governance.

The summit featured technical sessions, panel discussions and expert interactions on cybersecurity, forensic investigation, digital governance, artificial intelligence, fraud risk management and data protection – offering immense learning and networking opportunities. This flagship initiative reflected, in every sense, the spirit of our Technology Year.

International Yoga Day Celebrations

The Hyderabad Branch celebrated International Yoga Day on 21st June 2026 with great enthusiasm and active participation from Members and Students. As part of the celebrations, a three-day meditation and wellness programme was organised to promote physical fitness, mental well-being and holistic health – reflecting the Branch's commitment to the overall wellness of the Chartered Accountancy fraternity and not merely its professional excellence.

CA Day Celebrations

The 78th Chartered Accountants Day was celebrated on 1st July 2026 with the hoisting of the Institute Flag, commemorating the proud legacy of our profession and reaffirming the values of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The celebrations continued into the evening with engaging activities that fostered professional camaraderie. A special felicitation ceremony was also organised to honour Senior Members, who had completed 50 years of distinguished membership – recognising their invaluable contributions and commitment to the growth and prestige of our fraternity. More than 320 Members and their families attended the programme.

Other Flagship Initiatives

Other flagship initiatives conducted during the year included the A2Z series on Income Tax, Bicycle Day celebrations, the Professional Summit 2026, Prarambh – the Awareness Programme on Income Tax 2025, an interaction with the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (IICA), the Bank Audit Seminar, the Residential Refresher Course at Srisailem and the ABCD series on Microsoft Tools, organised for the first time for Members.

The Bank Audit Seminar was conducted on 12th March 2026 at The Marriott Hotel & Convention Centre and was attended by more than 800 Members. The A2Z on Income Tax Act 2025 seminar was held from 8th to 23rd of June 26. During the secession i.e. on 8th June 2026, highest number of physical participants have attended in the Branch's history, setting a new benchmark and a new tone of learning.

After a decade, the Residential Refresher Course (RRC) returned to Srisailam, with around 70 delegates participating on 3rd and 4th July 2026, under the divine blessings of Mallikarjuna Swamy and Bhramarambika Devi. Prarambh – the Awareness Programme on Income Tax 2025 – was jointly held with the Income Tax Department, addressed by Sri Sanjay Bahadur, CBDT Member and Sri Suresh Battini, Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax andhra Pradesh & Telangana. The interaction with the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs was jointly conducted with ICSI, ASSOCHAM and other stakeholders, the seminar was graced by Sri Gyaneshwar Kumar Singh, DG & CEO of IICA, The ABCD series on Microsoft Tools, offering practical training on various Microsoft applications, has commenced from 6th July 2026 ending on 11th July 2026, with the aim of enhancing the digital capabilities and skills of our Members.

PRESTIGIOUS RECOGNITION AT SIRC REGIONAL CONFERENCE 2025

The Hyderabad Branch achieved a moment of immense pride at the SIRC Regional Conference 2025, held in Chennai, by securing the Second-Best Branch Award (Mega Category) and the Best Branch SICASA Award (Mega Category) for the year 2025. These awards stand as a testimony to the collective efforts, dedication and commitment of the Managing Committee, Members, Students, volunteers and staff in advancing the objectives of our profession and delivering value to the Chartered Accountancy fraternity. This recognition further reinforces the Hyderabad Branch's position as one of the leading Branches of ICAI and inspires us to continue striving for excellence in all our endeavors.

FUTURE ROADMAP

Looking ahead, the Branch's planned initiatives include A2Z series on GST, A2Z series on Accounting Standards and A2Z series on Auditing Standards; A2Z series on Company Law Series; Insolvency & Bankruptcy Programmes; Moot Tribunal Initiatives; and the GCC Summit 2026. The Branch also plans to launch a specialised programme on the IPO Journey, to equip Members for emerging opportunities in capital markets.

STUDENTS' ACTIVITIES

The Branch continues to accord the highest priority to student development through a range of academic and skill-enhancement programmes. SICASA teams organised Industrial Visits for Students, in addition to a weekly Students' Speaker Forum held every Sunday at the Branch premises, aimed at honing their oratorical skills – with the aspiration that many of them will go on to represent Hyderabad at various ICAI competitions.

Other Student Development Activities

These include Marathon Revision Classes for Intermediate and Final Course students appearing for examinations, Mock Examinations to support examination preparedness and performance enhancement and Career Counselling programmes conducted throughout the year to make Students aware of the opportunities and pathways available through the CA course.

National Conference of CA Aspirants – Kairav: Blooming Beyond Boundaries, 2026

Kairav denotes a white lotus that blooms from all the odds – a fitting symbol for the journey of a CA aspirant. A two-day Students' National Conference was successfully held at Shilpakala Vedika on 23rd and 24th June 2026, under the aegis of the Board of Studies (Operations), ICAI and hosted by the Hyderabad Branch. The conference was attended by more than 2,200 aspiring Chartered Accountants. Student development remains and will continue to remain, central to our institutional vision.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Hyderabad Branch of SIRC of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("the Branch"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2026 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Although reconciliation exercise has been done and confirmations of balances have been received from the respective units, the inter-unit balances of certain wings of Head Office, Regional Councils, Decentralized Offices, and Branches are not tallying.

5. Compliance related to Fixed Assets.
- i. Branch is maintaining Fixed Assets Register and assets purchased during the year are properly being recorded in the said Register.
 - ii. The assets purchased during the year have been allotted unique identification code and same have been updated in Fixed Assets Register as well.
 - iii. According to the information provided by the management and examination of records, fixed assets has been physically verified by them at reasonable interval and no material discrepancies noticed on such verification.
 - iv. According to the information and explanation provided by the Management, the capital items are purchased by the branch after getting an advance from H.O and the remaining amount would be released by Head Office for reimbursement of such purchase in the form of capital grant after providing the utilization certificate.
 - v. The title deeds of immovable properties are held with Head Office. Accordingly, we are unable to verify that the branch holds the title of the immovable property pertaining to present Branch premises. Additionally, it was noted that property tax for the present Branch premises building is not in the name of branch.

No title, no money, no status goes with us.

vi. The branch is having its own premises but also carrying out some of the training classes from rented leased premises, for which the rental expenses are paid, which are within the permitted limits.

6. Seminar and Conference Expenditure

- i. The expenditure incurred towards Seminars & Conferences are properly accounted for and met out of the source generated by way of participation fee and Seminar/CPE Grant released by Head Office.
- ii. Separate ledger accounts for each Seminar, Conference, Workshop, or other programs organized during the period are not being maintained in the Tally software. Further, the details of income and expenditure related to event which get deficit and that to be reimbursed from head office are prepared manually by the branch and claims lodged accordingly. Consolidated income and expenditure statement are maintained for small events.
- iii. Since separate ledger account is not maintained for each Seminar /Conference/ Workshop / any other program organized during the period, there is nothing to be commented upon closure of ledger within 60 days, which was mandated.
- iv. Branch carries out several Non-Educational programs/activities during the year. Details of prominent ones organized by the Branch are as under

The Hyderabad Branch of SIRC of ICAI consists of 15,551 Chartered accountants and 34,682 students as at the year end.

2. A. Significant Accounting Policies**2.01 Basis of Preparation**

The financial statements comprising Balance Sheet, Statement of Income and Expenditure and Notes thereon are prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) and The Chartered Accountants Act, 1949 along with amendments from time to time. Indian GAAP here comprises of the accounting standards and other pronouncements issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The financial statements are prepared on historical cost convention, going concern and on accrual basis unless otherwise stated. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year, unless stated otherwise.

2.02 Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses of the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from the estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialised.

2.03 Inventories

Inventories comprise publications, study materials, stationery and other stores. Inventories are valued at the lower of cost based on first in first out method ("FIFO") and the net realisable value after providing for obsolescence and other losses, where considered necessary.

Cost includes all charges in bringing the goods to the point of sale, including other levies, transit insurance and incidental charges.

2.04 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.05 Appropriation to Reserves and Allocation to Designated/Earmarked Funds & Restricted Funds

- i) Income from investments of Earmarked Funds is added to Earmarked Funds. The income is allocated based on opening balances of the respective earmarked funds on weighted average basis.

2.06 Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment is recognised when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Institute and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. The cost of Property, Plant and Equipment comprises its purchase price net of any trade discounts and rebates, import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the tax authorities), directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use. Other incidental expenses and interest on borrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying Property, Plant and Equipment up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use are also capitalised.

2.07 Intangible Assets

Intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. The cost of intangible assets comprises its purchase price net of any trade discounts and rebates, import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the tax authorities), directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use, other incidental expenses and interest on borrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying assets up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use. Subsequent expenditure on intangible assets after its purchase / completion is capitalised only if such expenditure results in an increase in the future benefits from such asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

2.08 Capital Work in Progress

Expenditure incurred on construction of assets which is not ready for their intended use is carried at cost less impairment, if any, under Capital Work-in-Progress. The cost includes the purchase cost including import duties, non-refundable taxes, if any, and directly attributable costs.

2.09 Depreciation and amortisation

A) Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted as cost.

Depreciation on Property, Plant and Equipment is provided prorata on the written down value method at the following rates as approved by the Council.

2.10 Revenue recognition

The Revenue is recognised as follows:

- Class room training fee comprises fee received for Management Communication Skills Course ("MCS"), Integrated Course on Information Technology & Soft Skills ("ICITSS"), Advanced Integrated Course on Information Technology & Soft Skills ("AICITSS") and Orientation Programme ("OP"). The income for classroom training and coaching classes is recognised when services are rendered and related costs are incurred.
- Seminar fee is recognised as revenue when the Institute renders the related service i.e. when the seminars are conducted.
- Grants of Revenue nature from Head Office to be recognised on accrual basis

2.11 Other income

- Income from sale of publications and other related items are recognised when the risk and rewards are transferred to the buyer which normally coincide with delivery of goods.
- Interest Income is recognised on a time apportionment basis.
- Donations, if any, received during the year for buildings are recognised in the year of receipt.

2.12 Investment

- The investments of the unit comprise of short term fixed deposits with scheduled banks domiciled in India

2.13 Foreign Currency Transaction

Transactions in foreign currencies are accounted at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction.

Foreign currency monetary items outstanding at the balance sheet date are restated at the year-end rates. Non-monetary items are carried at historical cost.

Exchange differences arising on settlement / restatement of foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are recognised as income or expense in the Statement of Income and Expenditure.

2.15 Leases

The Institute classifies the leases as Finance and Operating Lease for accounting and disclosure purposes. The leases where the Institute assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of the ownership are classified as finance leases. The leases where the lessor and not the Institute assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of the ownership are classified as operating leases.

Lease rental under operating leases are recognised in the statement of income and expenditure on straight-line basis over the lease term. In case of Finance Lease, assets are capitalised at lower of fair value of the leased asset and present value of minimum lease payments. The lease payments are apportioned between the finance charge and repayment of lease liability. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of lease term or useful life of the asset.

2.16 Impairment of Property, Plant and Equipment and intangible assets

The carrying value of assets at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment recognised, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognised for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure.

2.17 Provisions and Contingencies

A provision is recognised when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made.

Contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events and the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Institute, or is a present obligation that arises from past event but is not recognised because either it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. Contingent liabilities are disclosed and not recognised.

Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed.
