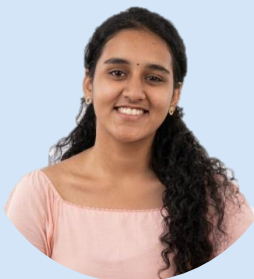

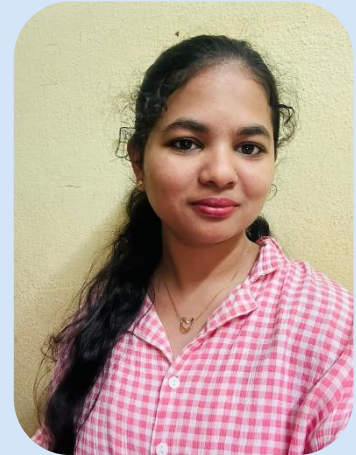

# KNOWLEDGE CORNER

## The Income-tax Act, 2025: New Statute, Familiar Tax Logic

Headlines across financial media have proclaimed...

*“The Income Tax Act 2025 replaces the decades-old Income Tax Act 1961, taking effect from April 1, 2026. It aims at simplifying the structure of India's income tax law and to reduce the redundant provisions, and reorganize the vast tax laws into a clear and streamlined format.”*

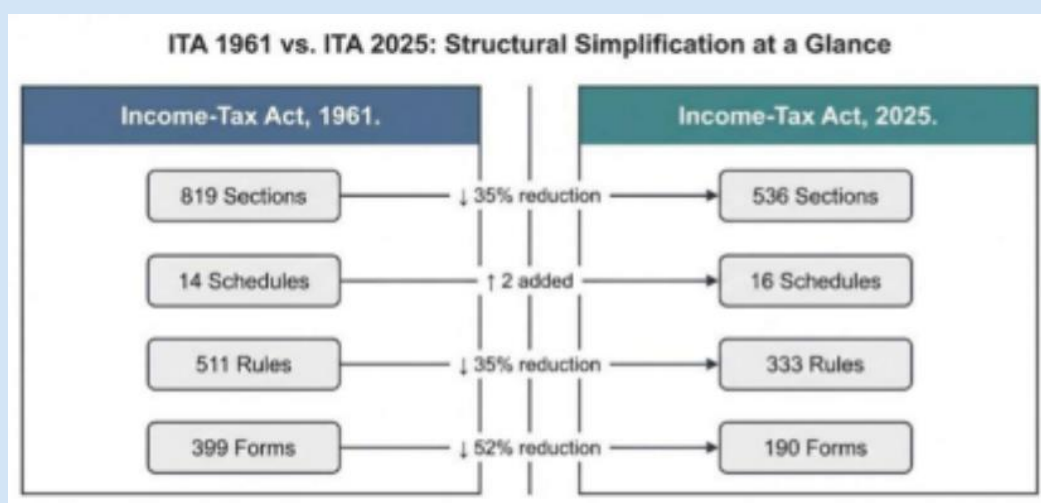
Income-tax Act, 2025 is unquestionably a new law in the formal sense: it repeals the Income-tax Act, 1961. But the larger question is whether it represents a true policy overhaul or primarily a legislative redrafting exercise.

The New Act's motive is to provide a streamlined, simplified, and modern tax code with reduced compliance burden, consolidated provisions, and clear definitions. While Tax slabs and core tax principles largely remain unchanged.

### KEY STRUCTURAL CHANGES - INCOME-TAX ACT, 2025

The Income Tax Act, 2025 contains 536 sections and 16 schedules compared to the 819 sections and 14 schedules of the 1961 Act. In the new Act, the overall complexity has been reduced because:

- (i) Explanations and provisos have been incorporated into the main text of the sections;
- (ii) Tables and formulas replace verbose narrative provisions;
- (iii) Redundant and obsolete provisions have been removed; and
- (iv) Cross-references are clearer and more direct.



## REDUCTION OF NO OF SECTIONS IN THE NEW ACT

The reduction in the number of sections is politically attractive and rhetorically powerful. It sounds like a dramatic shrinking of the tax code. But in practical terms, much of what has happened is that material previously scattered across multiple provisions has been consolidated into fewer, denser, and better-structured sections.

For instance, under the 2025 Act, salary-related TDS is addressed separately in Section 392, while a vast range of TDS other than salary are brought together in Section 393 in a tabular and consolidated format. That is a meaningful improvement in drafting convenience. But it does not mean that TDS as a compliance system has been fundamentally diluted.

Introduction of the terminology “Tax Year” which replaces “Previous Year” and “Assessment Year”. This “Tax Year” concepts under the Income Tax Act, 2025 simplifies the structure of taxation by removing the dual reference of previous year and assessment year. While the underlying processes of computation, filing, and assessment remain unchanged, the reform brings greater clarity and consistency in the way the law is expressed and applied.

## FEWER FORMS & RULES

The number of forms are reduced by 52% and Rules by 35%. That is not trivial. Fewer forms and fewer rules are the result of reduced duplication, improved usability, and made the law more accessible for the stakeholders.

Few forms like Form 3AF, 45, 46, 47, 75, 110 has been newly introduced in new act while the other new forms remain similar to the older one. Various (Old) Forms of similar nature are merged and are issued as a consolidated “New Form” like Form 3CA/CB/CD as Form 26, Form 10B/BB as Form 112 and Form 26 QB/QC/QD/QE as Form 141.

While the Rules are significantly reduced from 511 to 333. The old rules haven't completely disappeared. Section 536(2)(j) preserves circulars, directions, instructions, notifications, orders, rules, approvals, and schemes under the Old Act are still in effect and will be valid as long as they do not conflict with the New Act.

## SECTION 536 IS THE CLEANEST PROOF OF CONTINUITY

While Section 536(1) officially scraps the 1961 Act, Section 536(2) steps in to keep it on life support for almost everything already in progress.

If a case was already open before April 1, 2026—or if it's a new notice regarding an older tax year—the old rules still apply. This covers everything from basic assessments and penalties to long-winded appeals and court cases.

This is not a marginal drafting clause. It means that the old and new statutes will coexist operationally for years.

## STILL, IT WOULD BE WRONG TO SAY THAT NOTHING HAS CHANGED

Major Changes have been carried out for the Salaried employees who are the major contributors for Direct Tax revenue of the Government. The exemption limits for Child Education allowance is increased from Rs 100 per month to Rs 3000 per month, Inclusion of few cities in the definition of Metro cities for 50% HRA exemption and others.

The Due Date for filing the ITR Forms for Non Audit Business case has been extended to 31<sup>st</sup> August and Time Limit for Revising has been increased by 3 months, While this offers more time, revisions filed after the original 9-month window (Dec 31) will attract a fee of ₹1,000–₹5,000.

Inclusion of Crypto-Asset and Central Bank Digital Currencies within the definition of “Financial Assets” under Section 2(111) which defines “virtual digital asset”. This ensures that the digital holdings are formally recognised within the tax reporting ecosystem.

Income Tax Act 2025 ensure stricter compliance for NRIs through tightened provisions for reporting Foreign Assets. Failure to disclose foreign bank accounts, properties, or shares can attract heavy penalties. However, interest earned from NRE account remains tax-free.

Two-Tier Fee structure for delayed filing of Tax Audit forms. Starting April 1, 2026, the penalty for late tax audit filings is replaced by a graded fee system under the new Act. Penalties (0.5% of turnover) are replaced by fixed, higher fees: ₹75,000 for a delay up to one month and ₹1,50,000 for longer delays, designed to standardize compliance costs.

**Conclusion:** The Income-tax Act, 2025 is a new statute in formal law, but not a new tax philosophy in substance. Its real achievement lies in simplification: fewer sections, fewer chapters, clearer language, more tables, and a more coherent structure. Yet the Government’s own statements, the Select Committee’s observations, and the transition mechanism in Section 536 all point in the same direction: the new Act largely preserves the old tax logic, the old compliance architecture, and a great deal of the old administrative ecosystem. The 2025 law is therefore best understood not as a tax revolution, but as a careful recodification.

## How relevant is the old tax regime in the Financial Year 26-27?

In context of the old tax regime, the most significant and recent amendment was made to raise the basic exemption limit to 2.5 Lakhs for individuals below the age of 60, this amendment was introduced in the Budget for 2014-15. Since the introduction of the new tax rates in Budget 2020-21 the traditional tax slabs have become unattractive as they demand more supporting documents for the deductions claimed and result in higher tax expense for the individual due to its steep slabs. As a result in the AY 24-25 out of the total returns filed, 72% of individuals opted for the new tax regime.

Although the old/traditional tax rates resulted in a higher effective tax rate, it also allows for many deductions (such as Insurance premium, housing loan principal and interest etc.) under Chapter VIII of the Income Tax Act 2025 which greatly help in reducing the tax burden but the benefit that is claimed is also subject to the limits specified as per the act and the taxpayer cannot claim the entire amount of the expense as a deduction. The same benefit is not allowed in the new/default tax regime but the taxpayer can avail a lower effective tax rate without having the burden to provide proofs for deductions claimed.

Let's take a look at the same arithmetically,

**Scenario 1:** Comparison between the tax liability under both Traditional and Default tax regime for an Individual below the age of 60 earning a taxable income of 20 Lakhs.

Particulars	Traditional Tax Rates	Default Tax Rates
Taxable income	20,00,000	20,00,000
Income Tax as per slab rates	2,00,000	4,12,500
Add: HEC @4%	8,000	16,500
Total tax liability	2,08,000	4,29,000
<b>Effective tax rate</b>	<b>10.40%</b>	<b>21.45%</b>

**Scenario 2:** Taxable income required to arrive at a tax liability of Rs. 1 Lakh

Particulars	Traditional Tax Rates	Default Tax Rates
Tax Liability	1,00,000	1,00,000
HEC @ 4%	3,846	3,852
Income tax as per slab rates	96,154	96,298
Taxable income (Approx.)	14,41,000	9,19,000

In conclusion, from a purely arithmetic perspective the Default Tax Rates are no doubt the beneficial option as they provide the least amount of tax liability. Amongst the new generation of taxpayers, the default tax rates will continue to be the favorite whereas the older taxpayers will benefit from claiming their deductions, but the relevance of the traditional tax rates is slowly fading away.
