

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 1. As per the Information and explanation given by the management, Branch of SIRC of ICAI is maintaining all its books of accounts in Tally ERP cloud, which is being generally updated on daily basis and financial statements are prepared from the books of accounts maintained therein.
- 2. Various balances under inter unit balance aggregating to Rs.62,35,882/- (as per the details given in "Schedule-XI to balance sheet" are subject to confirmation and reconciliation which has been disclosed in the Financial statement vide Note No.3, to the Financial Statements.
- 3. We have been informed that GST, PF and ESI is taken care by Head Office and COE. Further, it is informed that the Branch records liability entries and transfer the same to HO/COE and will be paid by the HO/COE and same has been disclosed in the financial statements vides Note No.3 to the Financial Statements. Hence, we are unable to comment on the GST Compliance and impact of arrears, if any, thereon on the Branch.
- 4. The branch management has certified that there are no MSMED supplier's payables outstanding as on 31.03.2022.
- 5. Branch is generally complying with the Standard Operating Procedures, The following departures were observed:
 - i. As per the Standard operational manual (point 20), Confirmation from Head office is required but is pending with respect to Insurance on Assets held by branch.
 - ii. As per the Standard operational manual (point 8.4), it is informed that no such exemption certificate has been submitting to the Bankers and resulted in deduction of TDS on the Interest income. Forms 26AS was not made available to us ensuring whether TDS has been accounted correctly. We understand that details of the unreconciled amounts have been requested form the Head office.

6.

- i. Branch is maintaining Fixed Asset register and assets purchased during the year is properly recorded in the register.
- ii. Branch is maintaining a register of Fixed Assets with unique identification code, the assets purchased during the year have also been numbered and the same have been updated in Fixed Assets Register as well.
- iii. As per the information made available by the Management and examination of records, fixed assets have been physically verified by Management during the year and no material discrepancies are noted on such verification. However, it is seems that Chairs need to be scrapped as they are not in the usable as at the end of the year.
- iv. As per the information and explanation given by the Management, the Branch has purchased Laptops and Biometric equipment during the year. It is informed that the capital items are purchased by branch initially, and a Utilization certificate is provided to Head office for reimbursement of such purchase in the form of Capital Grant. The Branch is yet to furnish the Utilization Certificate for reimbursements as on 31.03.2022.
- v. The title deeds of immovable properties are held with Head Office and we are unable to verify that the branch holds the title of the immovable properties.
- vi. Branch is having its own building for Administration purpose.

- i. The expenditure towards seminar & conference are properly accounted for and met out of participation fee, seminar/CPE grants released by Head Office.
- ii. Work sheets for every program are maintained at branch office and separate ledger accounts are being maintained by the Branch for each of the Seminar/ Conference/ Workshop/ any other program organized during the year.
- iii. We have verified the work sheets mentioned above and have not come across any items remaining open for long and close within 60 days from closure of such program.

NOTES FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st MARCH 2022.

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. **Basis for preparation of Financial Statements**

The Financial Statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as a going concern; the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in India; the applicable Accounting Standards and the applicable guidelines issued by The ICAI in this regard. Hyderabad Branch of SIRC follows Accrual basis, for accounting.

2. **Fixed Assets**

Fixed assets are stated at Original Cost less Accumulated Depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price net of any taxes for which credit is attributable and any other cost attributable to bring the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

3. Depreciation

Fixed Assets are depreciated under WDV method at following rates on pro rata basis as per the guidelines of Head Office:

Electrical Installations	10%
Furniture & Fixtures	10%
Office Equipment & Air Conditioners	15%
Computers	60%
Vehicles	20%
Building	5%
Library Books	100%
Software	Depreciated over a period of 3 years

4. Revenue Recognition

- Staff & Administrative Expense Grant is recognized on accrual basis as per the revenue budgets approved by the Head Office. Capital Grants are recognized on receipt basis as per the guidelines issued by the ICAI in this regard.
- (b) Incomes and Expenses of Seminars, Coaching Classes, ITT & Orientation Programme, other incomes & expenses are accounted for on accrual basis.

5. Provisions

A provision is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow will arise. It is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which, a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimates required to settle the obligations at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

The Institute has been granted exemption from Income Tax under section 10(23C)(iv) and Section 11 of the a. Income Tax Act, 1961. As such no provision for income tax is made and no provision for deferred tax asset and liability is considered necessary at Branch level.

6. Allocation of Expenses

Expenses directly attributable to Hyderabad Branch activities are charged to respective heads of expenditure. Direct attributable expenses on specific activity / programme are charged to the said activity / programme while indirect expenses on such specific activity/programme are apportioned as expenditure of the respective activity/ programme.



7. Lease Expenses

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased item are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognized as an expense in the financial statements, as and when accrued.

B) NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

- 1. The outbreak of Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic globally and in India is causing significant disturbance in the physical activities of Branch. This has impacted the revenues of branch as there was a reduction in incomes which were generated through the conduct of Seminars, ITT, Advanced ITT, MCS, Orientation and Coaching classes.
- 2. Inter unit Balances are subject to reconciliation. Various balances under inter unit transactions between Branch and HO/COE is under confirmation and reconciliation
- 3. The apportionment of direct expenses by Hyderabad Branch of SIRC of ICAI, during the year as mentioned in Accounting Policy No 6 towards the conduct of ITT, Advanced ITT, Orientation and MCS Classes is as under.
